Greetings Faithful Members,

As we enter a new month, there are some things happening that I want you all to know. Your BSLC Council has been in action over the past couple of months not only to keep things flowing, but also to ensure that we move forward.

Our search for a full time Interim Minister proved to be more challenging than any of us thought it would be. After a couple of prospective candidates did not work out for us, the third candidate we received has been fruitful. His name is Pr. Mark Galbraith. He is currently serving as an Interim Minister for Trinity Lutheran Church in Great Bend, KS. He finishes his contract with that congregation late October. I initially spoke with Pr. Galbraith on the phone and then he made a visit to Amarillo on Sept. 10th -11th. He was given a tour of Amarillo by Erich Drochner, Laurie Dale and Greg Hinders, whom all graciously volunteered to do this and share their day with him. The tour included the Church and the parsonage. All Council members able, attended a meeting Friday evening, Sept. 11th to learn more about Pr. Galbraith and he learned more about our Council and BSLC. He really liked the Amarillo area and definitely was very positive and encouraging about the opportunity to be Interim Minister for our congregation. We successfully completed the contract with him on Sept. 18th with a commitment from him to begin as the Interim Minister for BSLC on November 1st.

Pr. Galbraith has a passion for bible study and already has plans for offering a weekday adult class after the holidays. He also plans to form small groups sometime starting in January, that will be answering some specific questions, to help us all together discern and provide input on what we believe is important in our mission and vision for our future. This will then all be reviewed to identify the common themes from these groups. That combined message will be then given to our Call committee to be utilized in our Congregational Profile. This profile is the document/ information our NTNL leaders will utilize to help find pastoral candidates for us to review and then selection of whom will be interviewed for consideration.

- Budget worksheets were discussed. The Ministry Plan will be completed at the next meeting.
- Motion passed to appoint a new church Treasurer.
- President informed the council that a piano will be donated to Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church to be placed in the Fellowship Hall. Motion was passed to donate the old piano to the Women's Center.
- Copies of the Columbarium By-Laws Update will be compare the revised with the original and bring back a recommendation at the October Meeting.
- Motion was passed to allow community based non-profit organizations to use our facility at the discretion of the office man-

 Motion passed to move the remaining Building Funds received after April 1) to the General Fund \$988.64, and to the Capital Improvement Fund \$2820.03 as per request of donors. The remainder \$1532.93 will be moved to Capital Improvement Fund.

FINANCIAL NEWS

August 2015

Cash equivalent asset balance at the end of August is \$136,840 (\$29,595) increase for the year). "Investments in our endowment Fund is \$118,605 (\$3,010 increase for the year).

August giving to our General budget was \$20,420 "Year to Date giving is \$191,100 compared to our anticipated amount of \$166,180. "In addition, our congregation has contributed \$4,190. "Total giving for August is \$28,860 (YTD \$231,650).

Expenses for August were \$23,450 (YTD \$165,955) compared to a budgeted amount of \$27,100 (YTD \$211,655).

Donations for August exceeded expenditures by \$1223 (YTD donations greater than Expenditures by \$25,150).

That course, though, may not be the wisest. For we, as a congregation, have grown considerably in using our spiritual gifts. And sitting back is not one of the gifts.

First, as we plan for the new year I wish to thank all those who have given generously of their time and with their offerings and special gifts. This past year we have not only sent a contingent of youths to the national assembly, but we have sent a young adult on a mission trip for a year. This was not accomplished just because the young people were willing to go. It was accomplished through all those who prayed for these efforts, and through those who contributed money to cover the expenses of travel to the assembly and the expenses of training for the young adult mission. And the fruits of those trips will come as we continue to engage with our teens and pray for David Roulston as he serves in Scotland.



That is how God accomplishes great things in using our hands.

It hasn't been that long ago when the first youth mission trip to Mexico required two years to raise the funds. Among the blessings of that trip was a developing sense that we can reach out despite being a small congregation, for it is God with us that accomplishes great things.

As we consider how we will serve as a congregation, we are dependent upon some simple principles. Pray about how we can spread the good news of redemption through Jesus through sharing the Word and living it as a vessel of grace. Pray for guidance on giving, not as a duty, but as a response to God's love.

Your gifts, for instance, allow the food bank to feed many hungry people. Hunger is relentless in a cruel and sin-filled world. It will not wait for everything to be perfectly in place here and we have everything just the way we want it with our congregation. The path of the cross will always be rocky. But we do not walk it alone. With prayer and an open heart, we will hear how God is calling us.
