From the Pastors

Christ Is Risen! He Is Risen Indeed, Alleluia!

Jesus said to her, "... Go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her. -- John 20:17–18 NRSV

Each morning Pastor Steve uses a devotional called *The Daily Read*er for Contemplative Living: Excerpts from the Works of Father Thomas Keating. Recently it had this reflection on Easter:

The first resurrection scene is cast in a cosmic context. From the scriptural point of view, the garden in which the tomb of Jesus was situated reminds us of the garden of Eden. The two gardens are juxtaposed: in the first, the human family, in the persons of Adam and Eve, lost God's intimacy and friendship; in the second, Mary Magdalene (out of whom Jesus had cast seven devils) appears as the first recipient of the good news that intimacy and union with God are once again available. -- Thomas Keating, *The Mystery of Christ*, p. 71

Throughout this Lenten season we had the theme of *Perfect Love Casts Out Fear* for our midweek services. The Easter Story – Jesus' suffering, dying, and rising to new life – is God's perfect love for us and for all. As Thomas Keating reflected above, Jesus' resurrection restored intimacy and union with God. In our sinful humanity, we have lost our close relationship with God. In the death and resurrection of Christ, God has restored that close relationship.

Mary Magdalene proclaimed "I have seen the Lord." This encounter with the risen Jesus transformed her sorrow into joy – she had seen God's perfect love and it cast out her fear. It gave life to her and connected her to God for the rest of her life and for eternity. She had to share this love and life to the disciples (her friends), and to all.

Evangelism sub-committee: Pastor Steve listed the 5 congregational members that agreed to serve on the sub-committee including; Carolyn Kelly, Susan O'Shaughnessey, Sonia Sanchez, Karen Herpich, and Jeff Antle. Hispanic Ministry Update:

Pastor Steve gave an update on his meeting with Belinda at the United Way regarding the community status and stated that she will serve as a community representative. The sub-committee will start working on issues with the Hispanic Ministry and will provide updates.

Pastors Report -Midweek Soup and Salad Suppers continue on Wednesdays throughout March and into April. Our theme for this year's Midweek Holden Evening Prayer Services is "Perfect Love Casts Out Fear." Our Young Adult group continues to go well.

The Panhandle Conference that was held at Beautiful Savior on Saturday, March 2nd was a great success. Those gathered benefitted greatly from the topic of learning more about how to have spiritual conversations.

W are waiting for confirmation from Kris Totzke (Assistant to the Bishop of our synod) regarding our supervising and mentoring the two students preparing for ministry.

Education and Youth - Andrea stated that she and a volunteer group will be gathering goodies and sending them to our college students. Andrea is working on a 20 minute bible study and/or fun and games for the smaller children each month. A signup sheet will be made to collect candy for an Easter egg hunt.

A 'Derby Day' get together is planned for May 4.

Property— Spring Cleaning is on schedule for April 13th. Specific tasks that we hope to accomplish include changing the nylon rope that suspends the Eternal Light with a plastic-coated steel cable, replace the cable at the bell tower and grease it, clean the pews and wood panels in the sanctuary and hallway from the sacristy to the Fellowship Hall, replace any burned out fluorescent light bulbs in the Fellowship Hall and elsewhere, remove mineral buildup on the shower heads in the locker rooms with a vinegar soaking.

The furnaces in the gym and the Fellowship Hall closet were repaired. Thanks goes to Chuck Jacobson's company for donating the cost of the repairs and working with Raeburn to donate the rental cost of the scissor lift.

Social Concerns— The Food Pantry served 213 families for a total of 318 people in January and February 2019.

We also plan to provide a box of food for Easter Dinner for needy families.

On Sunday, May 5, 2019 we will have a special opportunity to view products and creations in wood created by the hands of Christian artisans in and around the Holy Land region. The Rishmawi Family has been designated as the representative for these wonderful Christian artisans and has been authorized to show their olive wood carvings.

The tradition of Olive wood carvings in the Holy Land has been handed down from father to son since the 12th century. Due to the difficulties the last few years in the Middle East, tourism has been dramatically reduced and these folks have suffered greatly. This is causing the Christian community to immigrate to different countries leaving the Christian population at 2% today from 25% fifteen years ago.

We invite you to visit their display tables and view some of the finest handcrafts available from the Holy Land. This Family strives to bring these fine carvings to our church.

JASON MCCLANAHAN:


