

### FROM THE PASTORS

Here's a quick update about our Strategic Evangelical Mission Planning (SEMP):

The SEMP small groups are now complete. Thanks to all who participated and also those who led those groups. There was great involvement from about 50 of our members (that is over half of our active membership). The task force is summarizing the input.

The Task Force is still processing the Brainstorming Questions (a considerable amount of responses was obtained).

The Ten Missional Values exercise produced a consistent response for today – the top three were Caring For One Another, Service, and Stewards Of The Treasures (the rest were significantly lower). The exercise produced a wider response for the future – the top responses were Service, Caring For One Another, Nurture And Spiritual Formation, Witnessing, and Social Change And Advocacy (the rest were much lower).

Once the Task Force analyzes the rest of the data, we will share the results fully with the council and the congregation in December-January. After that we will work on choosing the community leaders who will speak to the congregation about area needs. Thanks again for the wonderful participation – God is working in us and the future is bright!

The Advent and Christmas seasons are upon us – To us a Savior is Born! This year I am reflecting on the familiar hymn: Go tell it on the mountain, over the hills and ev'ry-where; go tell it on the mountain that Jesus Christ is born!

This is an invitation for us to share the good news of this season, what it means to us and what it can mean for others, for those we encounter every week – family, friends, neighbors, co-workers, etc. Please invite and bring these loved ones to any of the services this season – Sunday worship, mid-week meal and Evening Prayer, or one of the Christmas Eve services. BSLC Treasurer's Summary November 13, 2019

For the month of October our income was \$16409.00 on a budget of \$21, 058.33. Our expenses were \$20912.49 on a budget of \$23156.43. Our expenses exceeded our income this month with a deficit of (\$4503.49). For the month of October, higher than anticipated expenses were well controlled in most areas with higher than anticipated expenditures for Staff Expenses were over for Janitor services by \$70.00 and Honorariums by\$200.00 (with Pr. Mike filling in for Pr Steve and Pr Wendi as we requested).

Other costs that ran over budget were administrative supplies by approx \$106.00, Fellowship expenses by approx \$80.00 (feeding families in crisis), Insurance cost was over by \$1159.00 and other property expenses were over by approx \$195.00. Our utility costs were significantly down this month which really helped offset some of the higher expenses for property.

I again appreciate everyone efforts to manage costs closely to be good stewards of our resources, you all continue to be diligent in managing our expenses. We will need to continue these great efforts going forward as we begin the budgeting process for 2020. Let us all pray for a healthy November and December giving to make up the losses we had this month!!


