The Congregational Meeting was set for January 24, 2015 after the 11:00 Worship Service.

In regard to the Call Committee, Pastor asked the Council members to come to the January meeting with possible candidates.

He recommended that the Council think of people from different age groups and visit with people to ascertain if they would be willing to serve.

One member of the Council needs to be an exofficio member of the Call Committee

Pastor further asked The Transition Committee and the Council to think of those who would be willing to facilitate the small group sessions that will be meeting in February and March. ### FINANCIAL NEWS

Cash equivalent asset balance at the end of November is \$151,800 (\$44,580 increase for the year). Investments in our Endowment Fund is \$112,900 (\$2,710 decrease for the year which includes \$1,000 provided for the National Youth Gathering).

November giving to our General Budget was \$23,185 compared to our anticipated amount of \$19,815. Year-to-Date giving is \$255,120 compared to our anticipated amount of \$248,600. Contributions to Dedicated Accounts were \$2,200 (YTD \$49,240). Total giving for November is \$25,385 (YTD \$304,360)

Expenses for November were \$14,450 (YTD \$216,780) compared to a budgeted amount of \$26,940 (YTD \$301,920). Since we do not have a Family & Youth Minister, the comparison should exclude the budgeted amount for that position. In this case, the budget for November would be \$23,725. Property (\$7,610 Budget, \$1,440 Actual) is the primary reason for lower expenses, resulting from payments being delayed into December.

Donations for November exceeded expenditures by \$8,735 (YTD donations greater than expenditures by \$38,345).

The budget for 2016 was approved at the November 22, 2015 Congregational Meeting.






