COUNCIL REPORT

The Congregational Council met on May 15, 2017.

New Business -

- Kevin Krallman was not able to attend but wanted to thank everyone for the work on the parsonage, especially Property.
- •Circle of Friends Childcare, the preschool just south of our church, wants to list BSLC as an evacuation site if they need to leave their building for an emergency. A motion was made that a Memorandum of Understanding with Circle of Friends Childcare be written to make our church one of their evacuation sites. The motion was seconded and passed. Cheryl will draw up the memorandum.
- Our constitution needs to be updated; a committee will review the appropriate documents and provide recommendations.

 MOPS- had their last meeting at BSLC on Saturday, May 13th.

Old Business- A motion was made to adopt the policy booklet with the table of contents identifying the current policies, any new policy will be added to the booklet and table of contents, which will be kept in the church office and electronically stored if necessary. The motion was seconded and passed. It should be noted that the Child Abuse policy is currently under revision

Evangelism—We learned that the lead person on the prayer chain would no longer be available to facilitate the prayer chain phone tree. It was suggested to revamp the entire process.

Consent Agenda- A motion was made to accept the Minutes with revisions, with the addition that the Pastors will be extending their office hours; hours will now be from 9 am - 12 pm and 1 pm - 3 pm Monday through Thursday. One of the Pastors will continue to be at the Palace Coffee House on Thursdays from 9 am - 12 pm. They will also be taking vacation, July 3-July 9, 2017 and have secured Pastor Mike Holmes to officiate the service on July 9th. The motion was seconded and passed.

Pastor's Report—We are just entering our second week of ministry with you, but we are off to a running start!

We have done several hospital visits already, had a premarital conversation with a member planning a July wedding, have a homebound visit and a house blessing scheduled for tomorrow, and continue to get acclimated to the area in general and Beautiful Savior in particular. We also participated in Derby Day, which was a lot of fun, and led our first worship service here.

We want to say thank you to everyone who helped clean and furnish the parsonage in preparation for our arrival.

Education- is working on VBS for July 17-21.

Fellowship- Extremely active—Derby Day was a success- donations raised reached more than \$3,000. The Committee hosted a farewell reception for Pastor Holmes and Sharon, a welcome reception for Pastors Steve and Wendi and a Mother's Day reception. They are planning for Father's Day and a Game Night in June.

Property- A motion was made to begin construction on the storage building to be located on the south west corner of the parcel of land that is south of the church's south parking lot at a cost not to exceed \$9,900. Seconded and passed.

Social Concerns—God fed 202 people through the food pantry, the sewing group is busy sewing on Monday nights, continued delivery of Meals on Wheels. A committed group continues to provide support to Snack Pack 4 Kids. One ramp was built.

Stewardship- working with Youth Committee on planning for the 2018 National Youth Gathering.

Worship— Worship leaders are needed. Sign up on the bulletin board outside the sacristy.

Youth— Discussions are ongoing regarding a trip to Camp Briarwood and possibly going white water rafting in New Mexico.

FINANCIAL NEWS

Cash equivalent asset balance at the end of April was \$143,729 (\$9,754 increase from the beginning of the year). \$79,914 is allocated to our Dedicated Accounts, the value of which has increased \$2,214 for the year. \$63,816 is available for the General Fund, the value of which has increased by \$7,540 for the year. The value of investments in our Endowment Fund is \$164,446, an increase of \$5,132 for the year.

April donations to our General Fund were \$27,703 compared to our anticipated amount of \$18,076. The budgeted receipts are based on historical giving. Other receipts were \$420 compared to an anticipated amount of \$417. Total Year-to-Date income is \$84,150, (\$13,074 less than our anticipated amount of \$97,224). Contributions to Dedicated Accounts were \$2,630. Total receipts for April were \$30,754

Expenses for April were \$19,000 compared to a budgeted amount of \$22,483. Year-to-date Expenditures from the General Fund are \$76,617 compared to a budget of \$90,321, resulting in a \$13,704 underspend.

Dedicated Accounts expenditures were \$2,073. Major expenditures were for parsonage capital improvements (\$760), Helping Hand Fund (\$156), Fellowship activities (\$364) and Flowers (\$502).

2017 Synod Assembly Report

This year's focus was on what 500 years of Lutheran heritage mean today. There was also an emphasis on Ecumenical relationships and fostering diversity and inclusiveness in the ELCA. Ecumenical speakers were Rev. George Mason (Wilshire Baptist, N. Dallas); Fr. Robert Williams (Roman Catholic Diocese); Rev. George Sumner (Episcopal) and Rev. Mike Thompson (Dallas Presbyter). All were Excellent speakers who emphasized that unity among churches is increasingly relevant as people move away from denominational designations and organized religion in general.

Rev. Sumner encouraged us to remain "full-bore Lutherans" moving forward. Bishop Gronberg will be attending a conference in Ft. Worth on June 17th to further the discussion.

Bishop Eric Gronberg's report coming 9 months after his election as Bishop cemented my impression that he's the right person for the demanding role. He did a wonderful job on all fronts and we are fortunate to have him. ELCA church-wide Vice President Bill Horne provided a state of the church overview as well as facts and figures of note about the populations we reach, areas of ministry and importance of our mission services around the world.

Minor changes to the constitution and election of suggested nominees to Synod positions were affirmed. Resolutions passed on supporting undocumented persons and the efforts of refugee resettlement organizations and global care for creation and awareness of science's role in studying climate change.

I attended workshops on the history of production of the Bible which included a demo of a replica Guttenberg press; and about what's next for the church moving forward and enlisting upcoming leaders as there are twice as many pastors retiring as there are seminary students preparing to replace them. I also received an interesting lesson on the History of Lutheran settlement in Texas.

The worship services were inspiring and uplifting with wonderful liturgies and live music. It was lovely to be in the presence of such a diverse group of attendees and visit with others seated nearby.

Attending was time well spent and I appreciate the opportunity to have served as a *BSLC voting member.
