COUNCIL REPORT

The Congregational Council met on Nov. 20, 2017.

New Business—

Carol Froeschle informed the council that the Family Promise in Amarillo is forming a leadership team out of the current seven congregations currently participating in its development of an Amarillo Chapter. The team is in the process of establishing a non -profit 501C3 and accompanying state and federal filing. Carol requests that Beautiful Savior add a dedicated account for the group to use until Family Promise of Amarillo opens its own accounts. A motion was made, seconded and approved for BSLC to create a dedicated account funded by Family Promise for a period of one year then review on whether to keep the account for donations dedicated to the Family Promise of Amarillo.

Carol also noted that the next Family Promise meeting will be on Jan. 18. at the First Church of Nazarene at 7:00 pm.

- The council approved the columbarium committee's request to raise the cost of a niche from \$300 to \$600 per niche.
- January's Semi-Annual Congregational Meeting will be on January 28, 2018 at 12:15 pm.

Pastors Report—The Table, our Campus Ministry Program for WTAMU students that is a joint venture with St. George's Episcopal Church in Canyon, has not succeeded in attracting studentsIt is likely that we will cease our involvement with this ministry and investigate possibilities at Amarillo College. Our prayer ministry at Palace Coffee House has also come to an end.

While we were at Briarwood for the Bishop's Convocation in October, we were approached by Rev. Jesus Escamilla, the Dean of the Latino Conference of the synod, to discuss the possibility of starting a Latino ministry at Beautiful Savior. He will meet with the church council in Feb.

Fellowship— - Richard Owen informed the council that there would be a hay ride at the Bergs on December 20 following the Holden Evening Prayer. Also following the December 6 and 13 Holden Evening Prayer services the congregation is invited to gather at Roasters for coffee.

Youth— Andrea Schmidt informed the council that the Marty Party was a huge success and that the youth/family members cooked and took Thanksgiving dinners to 10 households of shut-ins in our congregation

Property—The Property
Committee has selected the
bid from Janell's Concrete
for repairing the church courtyard. The repair work is
scheduled to begin December 1 and should take approximately a week to complete. Most of the stone top
squares currently in the courtyard now will be saved and
used on church property as
needed.

Concrete will be poured for the shed's foundation the 1st or 2nd week in December. Construction of the shed will follow.

Worship— We have vacancies for worship leaders. A signup sheet is on the bulletin board outside the sacristy.

FINANCIAL NEWS

October 2017

Cash equivalent asset balance at the end of October was \$128,120 (\$5,855 decrease from the beginning of the year). \$84,503 is allocated to our Dedicated Accounts, the value of which has increased \$6,803 for the year. \$43,617 is available for the General Fund, the value of which has decreased by \$12,660 for the year. The value of investments in our Endowment Fund is \$171,645, an increase of \$12,330 for the year.

October donations to our General Fund were \$19,205 compared to our anticipated amount of \$21,217 (\$2,012 less than anticipated). Other receipts were \$30 compared to an anticipated amount of \$417. Total Year-to-Date income is \$193,071, \$21,793 less than our anticipated amount of \$214,864. Contributions to Dedicated Accounts were \$3,652 and \$3,633 investment income from our Endowment Fund. Total receipts for October were \$22,888.

Expenses for October were \$21,153 compared to a budgeted amount of \$22,481. Major area of underspend was Staff Expenses (\$2,118). Areas of overspend were Fellowship (\$560) and Property (\$412). Year-to-date Expenditures from the General Fund were \$206,373 compared to a budget of \$227,960, resulting in a \$21,587 underspend.
