From the Pastors

Back in June, we attended a Stewardship Conference in Dallas. One of the sessions was from the Rev. Eric Law about his "Holy Currencies" program. What we love about his take on stewardship is the expansion of the normal stewardship of talking about money (along with talents and time). We want to introduce this program to you.

In Holy Currencies there are six blessings of currencies – Time and Place, Gracious Leadership, Relationship, Truth, Wellness, and Money. As these currencies feed into each other you form a Cycle of Blessings. As this cycle of blessings flows and grows, a Sustainable Missional Ministry is formed or reformed. That is what we pray for at Beautiful Savior!

First, a thought about currencies. Money is the most used currency. It really doesn't have value until it is exchanged for something – like food, clothing, shelter, a car, You get the idea. Money that sits and never gets used (circulated) gets stagnant and fouls up people, industries, or nations. Even retirement investing is of value when it gets used or given to others. Currencies are designed to flow!

In Holy Currencies we expand this idea of what is a currency as it applies to our church life:

- The Currency of Time and Place is the events (like worship and fellowship) and a place (like the sanctuary, fellowship hall, gym)
- The Currency of Gracious Leadership is leaders (pastor, council members, event leaders) that express in word and actions God's grace and love
- The Currency of Relationship is the growing of deep relationships showing God's love
- The Currency of Truth is the expressing and sharing of the truth, even when it is painful
- The Currency of Wellness is the growing of health and wholeness The Currency of Money -- well, this one is kind of obvious -- is the
- use of money for God's work

New Business—

Executive Committee Recommendations: The executive committee has reviewed and presented the following recommendations to the council.

- Balanced budget
- Benevolence to synod 10% of giving, not a set dollar amount
- Freeze all capital improvements for 2019

After a through discussion on each point, a motion for a council resolution to support the three ideas presented was passed with all in favor.

Reducing Council: The Executive Committee recommended to the council that it be reduced to 9 members plus the two Pastors.

A motion to task the nominating committee with securing five council member replacements for 2019-2020 was approved.

Pastors Report—

Both of us, along with Carolyn Kelly, attended the Congregational Development training in Seattle. Pastor Wendi and Carolyn attended the Latinx ministry track, and Pastor Steve attended the "Churches starting Churches" track. We developed a 90 day plan focused on educating the congregation about Latinx ministry.

Our fall schedule is now underway, with the resumption of confirmation and Sunday School. Currently, there are two Sunday School classes, one before worship taught by Jan Werner and one after worship taught by Pastor Steve.

Our Young Adult Group continues to meet monthly and is going very well.

We will take our final week of vacation for this year October 8 - 14.

The Rev. Law used as an example a church that was receiving rent (Money) for the use of their fellowship hall (Time and Place) for a yoga group. The church decided (Gracious Leadership) to get to know the yoga group participants (Wellness and Relationship). As that relationship grew, the yoga group noticed that the fellowship hall needed a new floor (Truth). The group found a donor for a new floor and someone to install it (Money) and they weren't even members of the church. As time went on the yoga group members began to see this as their church and some even joined the church. The church went from exchanging money for time and place and expanded the flow of all of the other currencies and are now riding the cycle of blessings into a sustainable missional ministry. They grew in stewardship and Health!

We hope this helps in understanding this way of looking at stewardship! We will be sharing more of this in the months and years to come.
