As February is the month we celebrate love in all its manifestations, I commend to you an article, for our edification and perspective, an informative and though-provoking article as to the historical roots of this holiday named after St. Valentine. It speaks for itself and give us much food for thought as we celebrate Valentine's Day:

St. Valentine, the Real Story By David Kithcart The 700 Club

Flowers, candy, red hearts and romance. That's what Valentine's Day is all about, right? Maybe not.

The origin of this holiday for the expression of love really isn't romantic at all -- at least not in the traditional sense. **Father Frank O'Gara of White-friars Street Church in Dublin, Ireland**, tells the real story of the man behind the holiday -- St. Valentine.

"He was a Roman Priest at a time when there was an emperor called Claudias who persecuted the church at that particular time," Father O'Gara explains. "He also had an edict that prohibited the marriage of young people. This was based on the hypothesis that unmarried soldiers fought better than married soldiers because married soldiers might be afraid of what might happen to them or their wives or families if they died."

"I think we must bear in mind that it was a very permissive society in which Valentine lived," says Father O'Gara. "Polygamy would have been much more popular than just one woman and one man living together. And yet some of them seemed to be attracted to Christian faith. But obviously the church thought that marriage was very sacred between one man and one woman for their life and that it was to be encouraged. And so it immediately presented the problem to the Christian church of what to do about this."

"The idea of encouraging them to marry within the Christian church was what Valentine was about. And he secretly married them because of the edict." Valentine was eventually caught, imprisoned and tortured for performing marriage ceremonies against command of Emperor Claudius the second. There are legends surrounding Valentine's actions while in prison.

"One of the men who was to judge him in line with the Roman law at the time was a man called Asterius, whose daughter was blind. He was supposed to have prayed with and healed the young girl with such astonishing effect that Asterius himself became Christian as a result."

THE CONGREGATION-AL COUNCIL MET ON JANUARY 18, 2016.

- The Congregational Meeting was set for January 24, 2015 after the 11:00 Worship Service.
- Motion was made to nominate Jeff Antle, Biff Flatt, Jonathan Hinders, Christine
 Johnson, Carolyn Kelly and
 Neal O'Shaughnessy to serve
 on the Call Committee. All
 had agreed to serve. Motion
 was seconded and passed.
- Motion was made to nominate Blair Berg, Jerry Moller, and Ann Coberly as alternates for the Call Committee.
 Motion seconded and passed.
- The Responsibility List was reviewed. Council members are to report on individuals next month.

- Motion was made to move internet service to Suddenlink. (as per request of the Office Manager in her report) Motion seconded and passed.
- Council Members were asked to update the Ministry Descriptions.
- Motion was made to accept the Safeguarding God's Kids Policy as amended and with the inclusion of Appendix 5. (Policy attached to minutes.) Motion seconded and passed.
- The Inclement Weather Policy was discussed. The phrase, Shelter in place, should be included. "Safety First" is recommended. It was suggested that a calling list be established to inform congregation of cancellations. Policy is in the Office Manager's office.
- Motion was made to pass the church Policy concerning guns as stated in the previous meeting. 1. Post signage at each door to prohibit Open Carrying of handguns in the physical facilities of (Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church), and 2. Any concealed handguns must be secured at all times. Motion passed.

Motion was made to nominate Sheryl Habeger to serve a 3 year term on the Columbarium Committee. Gene Reneau will serve the 2 year term and Dorothy Bivens will serve the 1 year term. Motion seconded and passed.

COUNCIL REPORT CONTINUED

FINANCIAL NEWS

Cash equivalent asset balance at the end of December is \$143,600 (\$36,360 increase for the year). Investments balance in our Endowment Fund is \$114,660 (\$930 decrease for the year).

December giving to our General Budget was \$18,260 compared to our anticipated amount of \$33,400. Year-to-Date giving is \$273,380 compared to our anticipated amount of \$282,000. \$25,000 was anticipated to be transferred from our Dedicated accounts to fund parking lot repaving. Since that didn't happen, the comparison should be to \$257,000. Contributions to Dedicated Accounts were \$5,650 (YTD \$54,900). Total giving for December is \$23,910 (YTD \$328,280) (see charts)

Expenses for December were \$26,090 (YTD \$242,750) compared to a budgeted amount of \$28,090 (YTD \$330,000). Since we do not have a Family & Youth Minister and the parking lot has not yet been paved, the comparison should exclude the budgeted amounts for those items. In this case, the budget for December would be \$23,725. Staff expenses (\$11,380 Budget, \$14,360 Actual) is the primary reason for higher expenses.

Expenditures for December exceeded donations by \$7,835 (YTD donations greater than expenditures by \$30,625).

In the year 269 AD, Valentine was sentenced to a three part execution of a beating, stoning, and finally decapitation all because of his stand for Christian marriage. The story goes that the last words he wrote were in a note to Asterius' daughter. He inspired today's romantic missives by signing it, "from your Valentine."

"What Valentine means to me as a priest," explains Father O'Gara, "is that there comes a time where you have to lay your life upon the line for what you believe. And with the power of the Holy Spirit we can do that -- even to the point of death."

Valentine's martyrdom has not gone unnoticed by the general public. In fact, Whitefriars Street Church is one of three churches that claim to house the remains of Valentine. Today, many people make the pilgrimage to the church to honor the courage and memory of this Christian saint.

"Valentine has come to be known as the patron saint of lovers. Before you enter into a Christian marriage you want some sense of God in your life -- some great need of God in your life. And we know, particularly in the modern world, many people are meeting God through his Son, Jesus Christ."

"If Valentine were here today, he would say to married couples that there comes a time where you're going to have to suffer. It's not going to be easy to maintain your commitment and your vows in marriage. Don't be surprised if the 'gushing' love that you have for someone changes to something less "gushing" but maybe much more mature. And the question is, is that young person ready for that?"

"So on the day of the marriage they have to take that into context," Father O'Gara says. "Love -- human love and sexuality is wonderful, and blessed by God -- but also the shadow of the cross. That's what Valentine means to me."

May this month and Valentine's Day, mean such to us as well! In Partnership,




The Bishop Election Committee will provide those named who agree to move forward in the process with biographical and additional paperwork that must be completed and will be posted online for all to access.
