The Congregational Council met on April 15, 2019.

Old Business:

SEMP: Pastor Steve gave a brief overview of the Strategic Evangelical Mission Planning process and discussed the next step of the process, which includes establishing a task force.

New Business:

A motion to allocate \$356 choice dollars to the sewing group was seconded and passed.

Harold Reed Bequest - \$2,006.37: A motion to put ½ of the funds designated to Property for a permanent upgrade to the facility and ½ under Endowment (undesignated) passed.

Special thanks to Ingrid Owen and the Fellowship team for coordinating the soup and sandwich suppers during Lent and the Easter brunch. Special thanks also to Marsha for getting us two trumpeters for our Easter worship services.

Our Hispanic Ministry subcommittee will meet on Wednesday, April 24th at 7 PM. Members are Sonia Sanchez, Susan O'Shaughnessy, Karen Herpich, Caroline Kelly, and Jeff Antle. Pastor Steve continues to lead the Monday afternoon Bible Study at the Wesley Center.

On May 5th, we will have an "Invite a Friend" Sunday. Bethlehem Christian Families will also be here that Sunday to sell their handmade olive wood products to benefit Christians living in the Holy Land. Education and Youth -

The paid flag service for the 6 holidays was discussed. A motion to pay for the flag service at a cost of \$300 was passed.

Finance Report: D'Ann Berry provided an overview of the written report and highlighted that both income and expenses were under budget for March with a net income of \$1,491.

Property— Keith reported that a new sign for the food pantry was made. The part of the roof that has bubbled is on the contractor's schedule to be fixed and a new bid to have the roof replaced on the hallway to the gym has been requested. A contract has been signed with Norris for the audio upgrade, but the project will not be started for another 2-3 weeks.

Social Concerns—

- The Food Pantry provided food for 180 people (62 families) in March 2019.
- A 'Frames of Love' presentation will be held in the fellowship hall on May 19 during the coffee hour.
- Several members of our Sewing Group attended the Volunteer Appreciation Breakfast at the HCC Amphitheater on April 11, 2019.

On Sunday, May 5, 2019 we will have a special opportunity to view products and creations in wood created by the hands of Christian artisans in and around the Holy Land region. The Rishmawi Family has been designated as the representative for these wonderful Christian artisans and has been authorized to show their olive wood carvings.

The tradition of Olive wood carvings in the Holy Land has been handed down from father to son since the 12th century. Due to the difficulties the last few years in the Middle East, tourism has been dramatically reduced and these folks have suffered greatly. This is causing the Christian community to immigrate to different countries leaving the Christian population at 2% today from 25% fifteen years ago.

We invite you to visit their display tables and view some of the finest handcrafts available from the Holy Land. This Family strives to bring these fine carvings to our church.

Mark your calendars now and let's have a friendly competition to see who can invite the most people!




