


God's Beloved People at Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church:

Everyone was asked to check the Church Calendar and make corrections and/or deletions. The Office Manager needs to know about events and plans early in order to compose the quarterly flyer for the congregation and deliver information to the congregation.

Budget (Ministry Plan) was discussed at length.

PROPERTY—The parsonage is being made ready for our new Interim Pastor. We have painted one coat on the parsonage; but still need help with the 2nd.

Security cameas are installed and working great. We are still seeking an additional bid for the parking lot.

WORSHIP— We still need 3 people to help with Altar Guild duties during Advent. The Chrismon Tree will be put up on Dec. 5th at 8:00 am.

YOUTH— Pr. Galbraith would like to have a parent meeting for potential confirmands sometime in November and would like to start Confirmation classes during Sunday mornings between services (during Sunday school time) in January.

October 2015

September giving to our General Budget was \$18,595 compared to our anticipated amount of \$25,060. Year-to-Date giving is \$209,695 compared to our anticipated amount of \$207,905. Contributions to Dedicated Accounts were \$4,545 (YTD \$45,095). Total giving for September is \$23,140 (YTD \$254,790

Expenses for September were \$15,780 (YTD \$248,835).




