Now thank we all our God, with hearts and hands and voices. Indeed, we thank God for it all. Amen.



COUNCIL NEWS

The Congregational Council met on October 21.

Business—

Constitution Changes: Proposed amendments to the Constitution will be presented to the congregation at the November 24 Congregational Meeting for approval and again at the January Congregational Meeting for ratification.

2020 Draft Budget: D'Ann Berry reviewed yearend projections for income. A budget worksheet by account was reviewed and discussed. D'Ann made a motion to accept the 2020 draft budget as agreed upon during the council meeting to present to the congregation at the November meeting.

Pastors—The SEMP (Strategic Evangelical Mission Planning) small groups are underway, with a total of over 50 participants signed up. We will have more to report about the results of these small group gatherings when they are completed in mid-November, but feedback so far has been positive.

We attended Briarwood for the Leadership Convocation. This year's topic was "Engaging Anti-Racism for the Whole of the Church." The speaker was Mr. Taurean Webb, and he led us through three days of thought-provoking presentations and discussions.

In other news, the Rev. Dan Lund will be visiting Beautiful Savior on November 10th to share information with us about The Church of the Damascus Road and, as previously announced, Bishop Erik Gronberg will be with us on Sunday, January 5th.

Property Committee: The gym floor was waxed on October 1st. The O'Shaughnessy's installed a new light in the sacristy and painted the ceiling. Thank you.

Social Concerns—The Food Pantry fed 287 individuals in September The Helping Hand checking issued a \$50 check to Excel to assist a senior with an electric bill. The Sewing Group resumed meeting on Monday nights to work on various projects. The Ramp Project continues to schedule ramp building for area residents referred by the Texas Ramp Project.

Our income for the month of September was \$24,504 on a budget of \$21,058 which means we were above anticipated giving by \$3446! Our expenses for September were \$18,845 on a budget of \$18,869 putting us at \$24 less than expected. Areas that had expenses above average spending were Utilities were approx. \$200 over budget, Repairs & Improvements were slightly over \$800 above budgeted amount and Landscaping was \$300 over the budgeted amount. Even with these overages, other areas were under budget and overall very well managed! Great job for working hard to keep our Church financially healthy!! Let's continue this as we work to finalize our proposed budget for 2020.


