FROM THE PASTORS

As you may have heard, at the Churchwide Assembly in August, the ELCA passed a resolution declaring us to be a "sanctuary church." We know that some of you have concerns as to exactly what this means, so we wanted to share some information with you.

As the ELCA website states, "In its simplest form, becoming a sanctuary denomination means that the ELCA is publicly declaring that walking alongside immigrants and refugees is a matter of faith...Being a sanctuary denomination means that we, as church together, want to be public and vocal about this work. It will look different for everyone, but welcoming people is not a political issue for us – it is a matter of faith." Among the talking points on the ELCA's website on this issue is the clear statement that, "Being a sanctuary denomination does not call for any person, congregation, or synod to engage in any illegal actions."

So what does it mean? Our synod's Bishop, Erik Gronberg, has writ-

further explaining it which we have posted in the church narthex (along with the ELCA talking points on the issue) and from which we will quote here:

+The majority of members of ELCA congregations, with the notable exceptions of first nations peoples and those whose ancestors were brought here as slaves or other means against their will, can trace their roots to immigrants. Our work with immigrants and refugees is a way in which we practice our faith in the world. In the wake of WWII, when 1 in 6 refugees in the world were Lutherans, Lutherans in the United States started Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service (LIRS) www.lirs.org.

+We do not yet know every way this declaration will impact our church. However, the Churchwide action in no way obligates the property or resources of any congregation or church institution.

COUNCIL NEWS

The Congregational Council met on September 16.

New Business—

The council reviewed constitution updates that will be presented to the congregation for approval vote during the November annual meeting.

Andrea Schmidt was appointed to join Johnny Reinshcmidt and Nancy Conley on this year's nominating committee.

Pastors—Family Promise (FP) has started back up again. They are trying to reinvigorate interest in the program, especially with the congregations that have signed on to be hosts (that includes BSLC).

SEMP Task Force Small Group gatherings are scheduled for late September through early November.

Council voted to accept Paul and Mary Jones membership transfer. The couple will join Beautiful Savior at the October 27 worship service.

Evangelism—is planning a 'Trunk or Treat' event for Saturday, October 26.

Property –The floors in the gymnasium, connecting rooms (kitchen, Youth room), the gym locker rooms, the Fellowship Hall and kitchen will be waxed soon.

To keep everyone as comfortable as possible in the sanctuary, the cooling temperature will be set to 71°F during the spring and summer months and the heating temperature to 70°F during the fall and winter months. With this in mind, everyone needs to dress according to their personal comfort.

Social Concerns—The Food Pantry provided food for 211 people (73 families) in July.



For the month of August, our income was \$ 16,575 on a budget of 21,058 which is a difference of (\$4,483). Our expenses for August were \$17,414 on budget of \$18, 262 which is \$1,534 under anticipated spending. This puts us at (\$838) less income than expense for the month. Other than Janitor cost being approx \$80 and BSLC FICA cost being approx \$67.50 over for the month, all other expenses were under budget, meaning all Council members did a GREAT JOB keeping their respective area costs well managed. As we go into budgeting for 2020, may God watch over and guide all Council members and officers to keep this same dedication to being good and wise stewards of the resources we have been entrusted to manage.




Each entity, including the NT-NL Synod, must discern what being a sanctuary church means for them.

+Sanctuary work can take a number of forms, many our congregations are already doing. The most important is that we be willing to have the challenging conversations about immigration policy in a way that leads to advocacy for bi-partisan action by our leadership to resolve the crisis. This could be hosting English as a Second Language (ESL) classes, partnering with one of our Latinx or immigrant congregations, witnessing and speaking as people of faith to end the detention and separation of children and families. In some congregations this means providing housing for a community member facing deportation. All of these are a step closer to sanctuary in our faith communities and sanctuary in our world for people who have to leave their homes. (end quote)

All sides on the immigration issue agree that our current system is broken and in need of reform. The ELCA is simply stating that we stand with those who are caught in the middle, unable to return safely to their homelands yet unable to legally enter the U.S. As the ELCA talking points state, "While we may have different ideas about how to fix this broken system and may have different ways of loving our neighbors, our call to love our neighbors is central to our faith."

Hopefully this allays any concerns you may have. Rest assured that we have no intention of asking the members of Beautiful Savior to engage in any illegal activities! If you have additional questions, please talk to one of us. You may also want to learn more about these issues by reading Pastor Totzke's blog posts on our synod's website, https://www.ntnl.org/courts-ports-the-issues/ and https://www.ntnl.org/courts-ports-the-issues/.

One of the things we appreciate about the ELCA is that no one from "on high" dictates what we all must think about a given issue. The ELCA's statements are not binding on individual consciences and you are free to disagree with them. At the same time, please know that there are good reasons why the voting members from all over the country have chosen to speak out in this way about this issue. Take the time to learn more about what the actual laws are and the impact those laws are having on God's children. Pray that our leaders may work together to come up with just policies supported by the majority of people. Pray for the welfare of those who are fleeing their homelands and hoping to find safety in the United States. Pray for our congregation and the ELCA as a whole, that in these divisive times we may find ways to come together and be united as the body of Christ. With God all things are possible!


