FROM THE PASTORS:

In the book <u>Ask, Thank, Tell</u> by Charles Lane, the following mission statement for a stewardship ministry is suggested: "The goal of our stewardship ministry is to help God's people grow in their relationship with Jesus through the use of the time, talents, and finances God has entrusted to them." Notice that this is very different from having a goal of raising enough money to pay our bills. Giving is an important part of the life of a disciple, and the Bible states that it is to be done "as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (2 Cor. 9:7)

Did you know that Jesus talks about money and possessions more than he talks about prayer, forgiveness, or his own death? Clearly it is an important topic, and yet in the church we often avoid talking about money. The fact is that our financial lives are deeply intertwined with our spiritual lives, because as Jesus says, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21). God gives us all that we have, and what we choose to spend our money on reflects our priorities in life. Of course, Jesus wants our hearts turned toward him, not toward wealth or possessions.

To emphasize the importance of thinking about how much you will give, and making a plan to put giving back to God first among your priorities, we are including in this newsletter and in a bulletin insert an estimate of giving card. *Please note that we are NOT asking you to turn this card in at church.* This card is strictly for your own personal use, to set a goal in your giving and see over time how closely you stick to your goal. We encourage you to put it on your refrigerator, your mirror, or anyplace that will enable you to see it regularly and be reminded of the estimate you made.

We hope you will take the time to pray about your giving, talk about it with your loved ones, and fill in the card with an amount that will challenge you to grow in faith. Trust God to provide, and watch what happens!

COUNCIL REPORT

The Congregational Council met on August 21, 2017.

New Business—

- Carol Froeschle spoke to the council about the forming of an Amarillo chapter of the National Program Family Promise, a program to help homeless and low-income families achieve sustainable independence. An initial community meeting is being planned at BSLC in October
- Both Pastor Wendi and Pastor Steve will join with St. George Episcopal in establishing a joint campus ministry for WTA&M called "The Table". They plan to have a regular Thursday evening meal at St George's Episcopal at 5:30 pm and will be looking for volunteers to prepare the dinners.

Education- It was noted that Rally Day will be on September 3 and Sunday school will begin on September 10.

Evangelism will see about the publicity for the 70th anniversary and obtain resources for the 500 anniversary of the Reformation.

BSLC's 70th Anniversary Reception: Worship Service 9:30 am (One service only). Reception to be held in the Fellowship Hall immediately following the service.

Property – A claim for a sinkhole in the courtyard has been submitted with the church's insurance company. The collapse of the concrete tiles in the courtyard has worsened and more voids are present near the drain pipe that runs in the middle of the courtyard. Alternatives to the current proposal by Legacy Support works are being considered. Bids are being obtained

We are collecting money for school supplies for Alice Landergin School (they will purchase the items they actually need).

FINANCIAL NEWS

July 2017

Cash equivalent asset balance at the end of July was \$130,904 (\$3,072 decrease from the beginning of the year). \$80,534 is allocated to our Dedicated Accounts, the value of which has increased \$2,834 for the year. \$50,370 is available for the General Fund, the value of which has decreased by \$5,906 for the year. The value of investments in our Endowment Fund is \$168,011, an increase of \$8,698 for the year.

July donations to our General Fund were \$20,240 compared to our anticipated amount of \$15,713 (\$4,527 greater than anticipated). Other receipts were \$1,415 compared to an anticipated amount of \$417. Total Year-to-Date income is \$140,283, \$15,773 less than our anticipated amount of \$156,056. Contributions to Dedicated Accounts were \$2,402. Total receipts for July were \$24,057.

Expenses for July were \$23,643 compared to a budgeted amount of \$22,233. All areas were underspent except Property. Insurance was \$2,281 overspent because premiums are paid quarterly but were budgeted monthly. Repairs & Improvements were \$1,106 over budget for the month but still underspent by \$1,017 for the year. Total monthly expenditures were overspent by \$1,410. Year-to-date Expenditures from the General Fund were \$147,539 compared to a budget of \$159,939, resulting in a \$12,400 underspend.

General Fund expenditures for July exceeded income by \$1,988 (loss).

Cumulative YTD contributions to the General Fund are approximately \$10,500 below the 2011-16 average.



BSLC ENDOWMENT FUND

An Endowment Fund was established in December 1992, as a tax-exempt entity separate from Church general funds, with an initial investment of \$33,800 and a charter which provided the framework for the establishment of the Endowment Committee to oversee the investments. Twenty-five years later, the overall fund balance (as of June 30, 2017) is \$169,506. This is the result of both strategic growth investments and individual gifts from Church members.

The Endowment Fund "shall enhance the mission of Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church apart from the general operation of the congregation." The current By-Laws governing the Endowment Committee provides for both designated as well as undesignated funds comprising the overall general Endowment fund. The income from these funds (interest and dividends) may be used to finance various projects which are not provided for within the general Church operating budget. Designated named funds may be restricted for specific use. The funds' principal is protected from use to fund projects operations.



The Endowment Committee receives requests to finance projects from Church Council and also from individual Church members. Such requests should be accompanied with a specific budget and must be approved by both the Committee and Church Council before expenditure is authorized. Various requests for funding have been recommended to Church Council and have been approved.

This is a brief description of the purpose and administration of the BSLC Endowment Fund and Committee. The Committee meets quarterly; the Minutes and Financial Statement are posted on the bulletin board across from the Altar Care workroom.

A recent gift to the Endowment Fund came from Joe Freshnoch's estate, which established a named and designated fund for which income may be used only for maintenance and upkeep of the Columbaria and Courtyard.

Individual Church members are encouraged to consider gifts to the Endowment Fund through Church offering envelopes, as memorials or within their estates. 




"The Parables of Jesus" presented by Dr. Ken Bailey
