New Business

- Labyrinth-The Property
 Committee believes that the
 issue of the maintenance and
 upkeep of the labyrinth
 should be addressed prior to
 the installation of a new pastor.
- Freshnock Inheritance- Joe Freshnock gifted a lump sum amount of money to the church. Our treasurer is reviewing the paper work.
- Church doors found unlocked- it was reported that the main entry door to the narthex from the south parking lot was not fully secured. The doors to the narthex have two types of locking mechanisms—one with a key and one with an allen wrench. It was reported that the allen wrench mechanism may not be working correctly. People are encouraged to check to make sure doors are secured as they come and go.

- Bishop Kanouse and Pastor Jane Mar will be retiring at the end of June. It was suggested that BSLC present them with a special thank you for their support over the years
- The NT-NL Assembly was held in April, however our church did not take up a special collection for this event prior to the Assembly, as is tradition. We can still donate towards the dedicated offerings established at the Assembly and will take up a special collection in the near future for this purpose.
- The main sewer line at the parsonage has been replaced with plastic sewer pipe due to the failure of the existing sewer system. In addition to the replacement of the pipeline, portions of the slab, subfloor and tile in the utility room, half bathroom and master bedroom must be removed and replaced.

Education—A joint VBS is in the works with United Methodist hosting. Also working on a end of school year party.

Evangelism—The Home Communion team met on April 17. Cards are being designed to give family members of shut-ins contact information for the church.

New Gift bags for visitors were prepared with updated informational material.

Fellowship—We will continue providing treats and drinks for Sunday morning fellowship hour. We will continue providing great fellowship for the church and community. We had a reception for a Baptism/First Communion Kids/Pentecost for May 15th. We are planning for the lunch that will be shared at the presentation of the conglomerated and summarized findings of the Congregation Conversations on May 22nd.

Office Report—I will be out of the office part of the forth week of May as I will be traveling to Denison, Texas to be with family and to place my Dad's ashes in a final resting place at the cemetery there.

Newsletter – Please have items for the newsletter to the church office as soon as possible and announcements for the Sunday bulletin by Wednesday mornings.

Back ground checks for key holders and volunteers who work with are youth are continuing.

FINANCIAL NEWS

Cash equivalent asset balance at the end of April is \$158,120 (\$14,515 increase for the year). The value of investments in our Endowment Fund is \$116,130.

April donations to our General Budget were \$16,470 compared to our anticipated amount of \$19,560. Other receipts were \$1,050 compared to an anticipated amount of \$20,200. We budgeted a \$20,000 transfer from our Dedicated Accounts to pay for the ramps and parking lot repair. That transfer has not yet occurred. Total Year-to-Date income is \$88,650 compared to our anticipated amount of \$113,010. Taking into consideration the \$20,000 internal transfer that has not yet occurred, income is \$4,350 less than anticipated. Contributions to Dedicated Accounts were \$1,720. Total receipts for April were \$19,230. (see charts)

Expenses for April were \$22,120 compared to a budgeted amount of \$38,075. \$15,000 was budgeted for parking lot repair. That expense was not paid in April, so the comparison should be to \$23,075. A \$1,220 expenditure for Mission Assembly was budgeted in April; however, expenses will be paid in May. As a result, expenses are basically to plan. A line item that will be overspent is Honorariums. We budgeted \$1,000, which was low considering our transition year. We may spend upwards of \$2,000 for the year.

Total expenditures for April exceeded income by \$3,490.

Have you considered joining our team of worship leaders as Lector? (Reading scripture aloud to the congregation during worship)


St. Augustine said, "Thy Word struck my heart and I love thee."

Mission Encounter Opportunity

Want to see what your prayers and support are doing first hand?

Join us February 16-26, 2016 in Nicaragua

Greetings:

Look for a flyer in the church narthex about our next mission trip to Nicaragua in February 2017. This is this wonderful opportunity to experience the mission field first hand. It is a very safe area that we have been active in for ten years and know the community well.

We want to keep it to a smaller group so participants can have more one on one experiences and not get lost in the shuffle of a new culture, new friends, and the work we will be sharing there. When we arrive in the rural village of Ojoche we will be staying in a small dorm we have built and in the Lutheran church. It is clean and simple with beds, hammocks, and air mattresses (if needed) to sleep on, modern plumbing, and a small kitchen area. More like going to camp than the Holiday Inn.

We invite participants to share any skills they may have with the community if they let us know beforehand and we can fit it into our schedule. In the past that has been anything from sewing, CPR, first aid, karate, embroidery, helping in the schools, drying foods, and vocational skills.

The flyer indicates what we think our main focus will be on this trip. God often surprises us with equally important needs that lead us to reassess our plans. Flexibility and a willing heart is a MUST on a mission encounter.

The cut-off date for registration is November 15th and the first half of your fee will be due at that time. The remainder is due Jan. 8th.


