Exciting things are afoot at BSLC!

The Call Committee and Council, along with myself, for Orientation regarding the full Interview Process, from filling out the Ministry Site Profile -Installation of your next Rostered Leader, ably presented and led by Pastor Jane Mar, Assistant to the Bishop NTNL-Synod ELCA. I am happy to say that BSLC has a strong Call Committee, who take their duties seriously, timely and prayerfully, under the leadership of Biff Flatt. I am **very** impressed by what I have seen and heard from them already!

Three timeline things to be mindful about:

It takes Call Committees on average **2-4 months** to complete the Ministry Site Profile (MSP). They have much to gather, demographics, contacts, community trends, financial info and compensation package, and most important: Mission Goals/Foci and Leadership Tasks the next Rostered Leader will need to help BSLC bring to life these Mission Goals. The Call Committee aims to be timely, and not "let the moss grow" (awesome metaphor, Biff!), but they will also take all the time needed to make the MSP the very best and authentic presentation of BSLC and her Mission to prospective candidates.

Once the MSP is approved and released onto the ELCA Database, expect the Interview-Installation Stage to take, on average, *6-18 months, give or take.* This is a *very* fluid process, all dependent on many things: pool of candidates available at any given time, their match of leadership skills and mission goals with BSLC, how the interviews go (or don't go), schedules, logistics, et al. *Any-thing* can, and does, happen: from the very first candidate interviewed is the match made in heaven, to the Call Committee turning back the first slate of (4-6) names and requesting a 2nd, even, later on, a 3rd (yes this *has* been known to happen!) slate of names. The point:

This Process takes on a life of its own, so.....
Anticipate anything!
Assume nothing.....and most of all....
Pray continuously!!!;)

COUNCIL REPORT

THE CONGREGATION-AL COUNCIL MET ON APRIL 18, 2016.

Members Present: Pastor Mark Galbraith, Linda Allen, D'Ann Berry, Spencer Berry, Tanya Berry, Laurie Dale, Erich Drochner, Kevin Krallman, Carol Froeschle, Greg Hinders, Greg Rohloff, Cheryl Hall and Susan O'Shaughnessy. Andrea Schmidt was not able to attend.

New Business

- Biff Flatt, Call Committee chair, updated the council with regards to the start of the committee's activities. Carolyn Kelley will be responsible for communications, Jonathan Hinders will handle the technical items, and Christine Johnson will record meeting minutes. The committee will meet every week on Wednesday evenings from 7-9 pm at the church. The committee intends to complete Parts III. IV and V of the Ministry Site Profile by July.
- Background screening on Pastor Mark, Cheryl Hall and all council members are underway. Multi state criminal and sex offenders checks as well as MVR- driving history type checks will be performed through SecureSearch. The next group to undergo background checks will be those who work with children.

• The church website was down for approximately 3 months. Spencer and Cheryl brought the account current for a cost of \$75/year. Spencer has updated the website and pertinent information, as well as included a Google calendar for recurring events (there is a link to the Church's Facebook).

Education—A joint VBS in the works with United Methodist Hosting. Also working on a end of school year party.

Evangelism—The Home Communion team met on April 17. Cards are being designed to give family members of shut-ins contact information for the church.

New Gift bags for visitors were prepared with updated informational material. Information copy was also given to the Pastoral Team.

A reception for new members will be held on Penecost Sunday.

Fellowship—Wednesday night soup/sandwich suppers created a great atmosphere for food and fellowship among many active church members, and even some new faces. Sunday morning coffee hour has been going well as normal. Easter Breakfast on March 27th was a big success.

Property –will remove the outer chain link fence north of the children's play area because of the fence's deteriorating state.

The floors were waxed and windows washed in April. A new ramp has been poured out side the narthex entrance from the parking lot. Also the gutter was repaired in preparation for ne asphalt in the parking lot.

Social Concerns—God fed 409 people through the food pantry, 1 ramp built, the sewing group is sewing each Monday, continued delivery of Meals on Wheels. A committed group continues to pack bags at Snack Pack 4 Kids and provide other support.

Worship—Beautiful Savior displayed new banners for the Easter Season.

A big thank you goes to members of the Altar Guild and Worship Leaders for their service.

FINANCIAL NEWS

Cash equivalent asset balance at the end of March is \$161,510 (\$17,905 increase for the year). The value of investments in our Endowment Fund is \$114,660.

Our congregation was generous this month. March donations to our General Budget were \$32,410 compared to our anticipated amount of \$24,405. Other receipts were \$325 compared to an anticipated amount of \$98. Year-to-Date contributions are \$71,140 compared to our anticipated amount of \$73,250. Currently those contributions are nearly what we anticipated. Contributions to Dedicated Accounts were \$4,000. Total receipts for March are \$36,730.

Expenses for March were \$22,170 compared to a budgeted amount of \$21,795. The major area of overspend is Property because of catch-up for utilities and janitor service. Overspend was for Pastor's pension/health insurance and Office Manager Medical for of catch-up for payment not made in previous months. Dedicated Accounts expenditures were \$1,650 (\$360 Helping Hand, \$500 for Youth, \$150 Fellowship, \$470 for Special Benevolences and Miscellaneous, \$160 for flowers).

Total contributions for March exceeded expenditures by \$12,910.

Being Made New

The 2013 ELCA Synod Assembly's plan for an expanded reach into missions is proving to be successful both in meeting the five-year financial goal, but also in inspiring mission efforts.

The assembly had set a goal of \$198 million for a variety of mission efforts. The four priorities are congregations, hunger and poverty, leadership, and the global church. These efforts range from training leaders for the future within congregations and mission areas, establishing new congregations, and ending malaria.

The campaign started in 2014, and through the most recent reporting period, 23 percent of the goal, \$45 million, had been raised and another \$3.4 million in current gift commitments and \$10.8 million in planned giving commitments had been made.

This giving has allowed an expansion of the Young Adults in Global Mission, the start of new ministries, funding for the ELCA Malaria Campaign, and in the past year the first class for women in international leadership began at six ELCA colleges, universities and seminaries.

This year, the campaign is focused on congregations, including projects to establish new congregations, to renew existing congregations and to expand outreach to our neighbors who live with disabilities.

Clearly this effort, which continues with the fund-raising portion through 2019, goes beyond of doing more of the same that has been done and calling that good enough. This campaign encourages the faithful to share how Christ makes a difference in life on a daily basis with both our neighbors within our community and around the world. That difference is how we tell the world that Beautiful Savior is alive and vital.

This commitment calls us to consider not only how much we as individuals should give through our weekly offerings and tithes and through our wills and bequests in planned giving, but also how we can stir the Good News through the missions and efforts of Beautiful Savior.

Greetings to All,

Your Council has reviewed and revised the previously established Safeguarding God's Children Policy in the past couple of months. It requires, along with our Liability insurance, that we take care to ensure those that are working regularly with children/youth in our Church or on our Church property and those that may also have a key with regular access to the building when children/youth are present have a background check and training on reducing the risk of abuse to children/youth. Those volunteers or staff that transport children/youth for activities also must have a driving record check.

This policy is for the purpose of keeping our children/youth safe and protect them from harm as a result of any intentional abuse. As a council, we recognize this is a serious issue and many hours have gone into getting this policy revised to be current according to the NTNL recommendations and our Liability insurance requirements.

So you are not surprised, this letter is to inform you that you if you are volunteering or working with children/youth, or you have a key to the building, you will be receiving a request to complete an approval form for a background check in the near future. Following this you will receive a Screening form to complete and for those that work/volunteer regularly with youth there will be an application form to complete. And finally there is training that is also required that will be made available online to complete either in a group setting or individually.

The background check will be required every 5 years and the training will be required every 3 years.

As many of you know, the issue of child/youth abuse is present everywhere, even in Amarillo, TX. We must be good stewards and more importantly good Christians in our efforts to protect our children/youth from harm.

Your timely response to these requests is important so that we can get all completed to be in compliance with our policy. If you have any questions, please feel free to ask me or Youth Council chair, Andrea Schmidt or for help with the forms, Cheryl Hall will be a great resource.

Thank you for your commitment and dedication to our children/youth and to Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church.

2016 NTNL Mission Assembly April 22-24, 2016 BSLC Voting Members Report

Greetings BSLC Congregation!

The Assembly theme this year was "To the Ends of the Earth". The activities started Friday morning with an orientation of new attendees at 10am. At 12pm there was an opening Worship service with Bishop Kanouse delivering the message. This was a traditional worship service. Follow this was an explanation for



the Bishop election process by Rev. Linda Norman, an the ELCA Church-wide representative. The eclesiastical ballot is the process used for Bishop elections in the ELCA. For the first and second votes, a written ballot is required and for third and subsequent votes an electronic device may be used. We practiced with some fun questions to test the devices. The official first vote involved each voting member writing the one person they wanted to be a nominee. Although, there were already 12 potential nominees that had been asked to consider seek the Bishop nomination, this was not official until this first vote. All of the potential nominees that were already seeking the nomination and several others were nominated on this first ballot. Once nominated, only those nominees that chose to accept the nomination were officially named as nominees on the ballot. A second vote was then taken by written ballot with a list of the nominees that accepted. Each voting member selected one nominee. The rules for voting members in the election process is very specific and strict. Due to some voting members registrations not getting saved into the system, the second vote was declared not legal. This resulted in the need to retake the second vote again on Saturday morning.

Friday evening ended with a dinner and recognition program. Bishop's staff was recognized and announcement of some that are retiring including Pr. Stephen Kanouse, Pr. Jane Mar and a few others. Pastor's in the mission area celebrating 20, 25, 30, 35, 40, 45, 50 and 60 year anniversaries of ordination. Pr. Mike Holmes was recognized for 45 years! And former Bishop Mark Herbner was recognized for 60 years and he was able to be there to receive this special recognition. Two congregation Churches were recognized for anniversaries with King of Glory in Dallas celebrating 50 years and Trinity Lutheran Church in Pottsville, TX celebrating 125 years!

On Saturday, activities started at 8:15am with a morning message and prayers. The theme was one of a journey with a message "What do you pack for a journey like this?" This message, don't take your own personal time-lines, schedules and agendas, but do take salt, water and oil. After this, with 305 registered and affirmed voting members eligible, a second vote was taken for the Bishop candidates. Following the vote, we listened to each of the remaining eight candidates give a 5 minute talk about themselves. The candidates were Phil Geleske, Nick Billardello, Jeffrey Borgwardt, Mark Hander, Jane Mar, Russell Vardell, Erik Gronberg and Kathi Johnson. Following this Stephanie Varnum, Vice President of the NTNL Mission area gave a report on the installation of the new Bishop in Sierra Leone, Bishop Momoh. Pr. Jane Mar, Bishop Assistant also attended the installation. The election committee named the top seven candidates selected from the second vote.

They were Phil Geleske, Nick Billardello, Mark Hander, Jane Mar, Russell Vardell, Erik Gronberg and Kathi Johnson. Dr. Rev. Jay Alanis led a Bible Study on the impact Lutheran missionaries have made down at the Mexico border. Rev. Linda Norman and Clarence Smith, a member on the ELCA Church-wide council, gave a ELCA Church-wide report. During the report, a video with ELCA Bishop, Elizabeth Eaton, with a message that the ELCA is a Church first and second an organization with a mission to help others in need.

The consistent theme she stressed was that "We are the Church for the sake of the World". The third vote was done by electronic ballot for selection of the top three candidates. There were 307 registered voting members affirmed. The results were announced shortly thereafter with Phil Geleske, Jane Mar and Erik Gronberg being selected. Voting members broke out in three groups for lunch with each of the top three candidate rotating to each group for a question and answer session. Voting members then returned to the main assembly room and the top three candidates were brought out separately and ask 3 specific question to which they each answered as to their personal views on each question. The fourth vote was taken by electronic ballot. The top two candidate were selected- Jane Mar and Erik Gronberg. Due to problems with some devices being inconsistent in working, after a motion, an amendment to the motion and much discussion, the voting members voted to try the electronic ballot for the fifth vote but if all voting members devices did not work, then we would go to paper ballot. The fifth vote was then taken on the electronic ballot, however there were some voting member 's devices that did not work. A paper ballot then was prepared and then given to voting members. From that vote, Pr. Erik Gronberg was elected with the majority of votes! That evening we attended a celebration banquet for Bishop Kevin Kanouse and his wife, Billye Jean. Entertainment at the banquet was provided by an all male vocal group, Vocal Majority. Very much enjoyed by all! There were many speeches given in honor of Bishop Kevin and Billye Jean from staff, Pastors, fellow neighboring synod Bishops and others.

Sunday morning began with a worship service at 9am. This was followed by a report on Briarwood by Pr. Phil Geleske. Then a report from the Committee for Reference and Council by Pr. John Bell. Stephanie Varnum gave the Vice President report. Todd Weiss gave the secretary report that included presentation of the 2017 Care and Compensation and the Minutes from the 2015 Assembly. From the motion and second on these items, the voting members approved each of these items. Mark Bradley presented the Treasurer's report and budget for 2017. From a motion and second, the voting members approved the report and 2017 budget. An announcement was made that the 2017 Mission Assembly will be held in Plano Texas at the Legacy Village.

The Assembly concluded with a final contemporary worship service. Bishop Kanouse delivered the message and Bishop Elect presided over Holy Communion. After the final blessing, the Assembly was then adjourned.

We both were honored to serve as the voting members for BSLC. Thank you all for supporting and encouraging us in our representing our Church. This was a very holy spirit filled and interesting experience with the election of a new Bishop for our Mission Area. We hope you find this brief overview helpful and informative.



The Assisting Minister – An Invitation

Have you considered joining our team of worship leaders as an assisting minister? Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church is seeking to expand the ministry of "assisting minister."

The assisting minister role has deep roots in Christian history. The early church commissioned deacons to take extra food from the offering at holy communion to those in need. In this role they came to serve as assisting ministers in worship to describe it briefly, serve in worship; by praying for the needs of the world, receiving and giving thanks for the offering, setting the table with bread and wine, assisting the presiding minister at the table, serving the people, and sending the people forth to love and serve their neighbor.



The assisting minister serves with an understanding all the parts of worship and how they work together. The assisting minister role gets it particular shape from its dual responsibility in assisting the gathered community in its worship and at the same time assisting the presiding minister in his/her leadership. This ancient role has its own dignity and centrality within worship and, along with the presiding minister, offers continuity of leadership throughout the worship service.

We hope this abbreviated description will encourage interested candidates to consider serving as an assisting minister. A handbook of worship jobs (including assisting ministers) is located on the bulletin board just outside the sacristy. Ruth — a Pentecost story?

The disciples were celebrating Pentecost, originally a Jewish festival, when the Holy Spirit descended on them and birthed the church. Pentecost, which began as a harvest festival, had come to commemorate the giving of the law. The book of Ruth became integral to festival worship.


Why Ruth? This short story doesn't mention the law, let alone God giving it to Moses. Yet in Ruth's devotion to her mother-in-law ("Where you go I will go Your people will be my people ... " [Ruth 1:16, NIV]), she fulfills not just the letter but the spirit of the law: lovingkindness — all the more remarkable because she's a foreigner. Boaz, too, demonstrates exorbitant kindness to Ruth.

As Christians celebrate the Spirit bridging differences in Jerusalem, uniting all nationalities by making the gospel message intelligible to all people, we too can remember Ruth's story. For in it, God unites two enemy peoples for his grand purpose: Boaz and Ruth's marriage leads to King David and,

ultimately, to King Jesus. Today, the Holy Spirit continues to unite all categories of people under Christ's reign for the good of the world.
