"Ah,,, Christmas!" ... so says one of the characters in the musical "Scrooged in Astoria", that I performed in its first 2 seasons in Astoria OR. I love everything about these holidays...the lights, sounds, sights, tastes, traditions, family, memories new and old...all of it! Because this is a weeks-long celebration ro prepare for the birth of the King of Kings and Lord of Lords! I'm all about singing the Carols of Christmas even throughout Advent and through Epiphany. Why not?;) Following is a meditation on Christmas, from one of my favorite authors and teachers of the faith, Frederic Buercher, Read, ponder and enjoy:

"The lovely old carols played and replayed till their effect is like a dentist's drill or a jackhammer, the bathetic banalities of the pulpit and the chilling commercialism of almost everything else, people spending money they can't afford on presents you neither need nor want, "Rudolph, the Red-Nosed Reindeer," the plastic tree, the cornball creche, the Hallmark Virgin. Yet for all our efforts, we've never quite managed to ruin it. That in itself is part of the miracle, a part you can see. Most of the miracle you can't see, or don't.

The young clergyman and his wife do all the things you do on Christmas Eve. They string the lights and hang the ornaments. They supervise the hanging of the stockings. They tuck in the children. They lug the presents down out of hiding and pile them under the tree. Just as they're about to fall exhausted into bed, the husband remembers his neighbor's sheep. The man asked him to feed them for him while he was away, and in the press of other matters that night he forgot all about them. So down the hill he goes through knee-deep snow. He gets two bales of hay from the barn and carries them out to the shed. There's a forty-watt bulb hanging by its cord from the low roof, and he turns it on. The sheep huddle in a corner watching as he snaps the baling twine, shakes the squares of hay apart, and starts scattering it. Then they come bumbling and shoving to get at it with their foolish, mild faces, the puffs of their breath showing in the air. He is reaching to turn off the bulb and leave when suddenly he realizes where he is. The winter darkness. The glimmer of light. The smell of the hay and the sound of the animals eating. Where he is, of course, is the manger.

COUNCIL REPORT

THE CONGREGATIONAL COUNCIL MET ON OCTOBER 19, 2015.

Members Present: D'Ann Berry, Erich Drochner, Spencer Berry, Laurie Dale, Carol Froeschle, Karen Herpich, Greg Hinders, Christine Johnson, Tanya Rosenthal, and Office Manager Cheryl Hall. Kevin Krallman Greg Rohloff, and Shirley Petersen, were unable to attend.

The Christmas Day Service was discussed. Because Marsha will not be available to play and attendance has been sparse in the past, a motion was made and passed to forego Christmas morning services.

Sunday after Christmas was also discussed. Pastor Galbaith will not be here that Sunday and suggested we have one Service of Carols and Readings; no Holy Communion at 9:30 am on Sunday, December 27. A motion was made and passed to implement the suggestion.

Pastor Galbraith advocated for a 7:00 pm and 10:00 pm time for the Christmas Eve Services. After some discussion the Council approved these times. Also added to the Agenda was discussion of changes to Texas State Gun Laws. A Seminar will be held in Dallas on December 1, 2015 to address possible implications to the life of our church as a result of these changes to the law. Pastor Galbraith will look into attending the seminar.

Old Business:

Columbarium Policies and Procedures were briefly discussed. Dorothy Bivens and Gene Reneau are presently on the committee. One more congregational member who owns a niche needs to be appointed to serve.

Christine Johnson presented the updated (Safeguarding God's Kids Policy. Christine Johnson will work on forming a committee to review the policy and oversee actions.

SOCIAL CONCERNS-

The Food pantry fed 251 people in October. 1 ramp was built, the sewing group is making winter hats and working on Christmas stockings.

WORSHIP— Have Altar Guild members assigned for Advent Services. Working with Pastor, Marsha, Karen, Bob on music for the next few months.

YOUTH— We are going to be doing some brainstorming about our youth and upcoming confirmation. Pr. Galbraith would like to meet with parents sometime before Christmas and then start confirmation study in January. We have 6 kids that are in this age group.

He only just saw it. He whose business it is above everything else to have an eye for such things is all but blind in that eye. He who on his best days believes that everything that is most precious anywhere comes from that manger might easily have gone home to bed never knowing that he had himself just been in the manger. The world is the manger. It is only by grace that he happens to see this other part of the miracle.

Christmas itself is by grace. It could never have survived our own blindness and depredations otherwise. It could never have happened otherwise. Perhaps it is the very wildness and strangeness of the grace that has led us to try to tame it. We have tried to make it habitable. We have roofed it in and furnished it. We have reduced it to an occasion we feel at home with, at best a touching and beautiful occasion, at worst a trite and cloying one. But if the Christmas event in itself is indeed—as a matter of cold, hard fact—all it's cracked up to be, then even at best our efforts are misleading.

The Word become flesh. Ultimate Mystery born with a skull you could crush one-handed. Incarnation. It is not tame. It is not touching. It is not beautiful. It is uninhabitable terror. It is unthinkable darkness riven with unbearable light. Agonized laboring led to it, vast upheavals of intergalactic space/time split apart, a wrenching and tearing of the very sinews of reality itself. You can only cover your eyes and shudder before it, before this: "God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God . . . who for us and for our salvation," as the Nicene Creed puts it, "came down from heaven." Came down. Only then do we dare uncover our eyes and see what we can see. It is the Resurrection and the Life she holds in her arms. It is the bitterness of death he takes at her breast"

FINANCIAL NEWS

The October Balance Sheet shows a cash equivalent asset balance of \$142,028 (\$34,784 increase for the year). Balance for our investments in our Endowment Fund is \$112,883 (\$2,710 decrease for the year which includes \$1,000 provided for the National Youth Gathering).

October giving to our General Budget was \$22,242 compared to our anticipated amount of \$20,882. Year-to-Date giving is \$231,938 compared to our anticipated amount of \$228,787. Contributions to Dedicated Accounts were \$1,945 (YTD \$47,045). Total giving for October is \$24,190 (YTD \$278,980).

Expenses for October were \$20,595 (YTD \$202,330) compared to a budgeted amount of \$26,140 (YTD \$274,975). Since we do not have a Family & Youth Minister, the comparison should exclude the budgeted amount for that position. In this case, the budget for October would be \$22,925 (YTD \$242,808).

Donations for October exceeded expenditures by \$1,650 (YTD donations greater than expenditures by \$29,610).

It is anticipated that expenditures approved for 2015 parking lot paving and handicapped ramps will not be spent, even though funds are available. It is recommended that the funds be carried over to the 2016 budget for parking lot paving and handicapped ramps.


Choir Cantata Sunday, December 13

Dear Partners in ministry at BSLC:

First of all, A BIG BIG Texas-sized ~~THANK YOU~~ for your warm welcomes, moving assistances, gift cards, meals out, home invites, etc. etc. I feel at home already! I see already that one of the spiritual gifts that God has graced BSLC is the spiritual gift of hospitality. Keep stoking that one!!

Second, I'm presenting the outline of the "Year Ahead" and the Interim Ministry "Game Plan", as I presented it to your council 11/16/2105 during their regular meeting. I provide this for you as I strive to practice good communication, and to keep y'all in the loop as to what you can expect during this exciting Interim and Discernment Season. Please bear with the length, however I want to make sure it is all "in writing, please", and laid out clearly for you, so you know what is likely to occur. I'd rather keep you over-informed, than under-informed!

Setting the Table for our year ahead: (FYI to read over on your own. More info to come on a broader scale as and when needed):

Confirmation 2016

Will be offered for all 7th-8th graders (and 6th graders if any are desirous and ready) who are desirous of a season of focused learning to prepare for Affirmation of Baptism

Classes will be Sunday morns during the Education Hour

January 10_April 24, 2016 (16 sessions)

Using the Re:form curriculum (one I've used in previous settings)

Suggested dates for Rite of Affirmation of Baptism: Pentecost Sunday 06/04/2016 or Reformation Sunday 10/30/2016 (to be discussed and decided together with students and parents)

Next session of Confirmation will begin 09/17/2016 (tentative).

The Divine Drama

A 30-week immersion into the biblical narrative (16 sessions) and the biblical basis for core Christian teaching (14 sessions)

The Divine Drama The Biblical Narrative: Tuesday morn (9:30-11:00 am) or Tuesday eve 7:00-8:30 pm., January 12, 2016-May 10, 2016

The Divine Drama Our Narrative: Tuesday Morns (9:30-11:00 am) or Tuesday eves (7:00-8:30 pm) beginning 09/13/2016 (tentative)

Participants come to either morn or eve session each week, per their schedule

Purpose is to see the "big picture" of the biblical narrative in its unity, and to be immersed into God's Story, to help inform Our Story, to help give BSLC some Big Picture Mission directives to inform your next Mission Goals

To model an example of a good Adult Faith Formation offering, as Adult Faith Formation has been identified as a key area of growth.

Home Communion Visits:

I will be partnering with the Home Communion Ministers to:

Review/train into basics of Home Communion Visits

Help the Team to organize visits and schedule

I will go along to each visit, along with the HCMs (Home Communion Ministers) the first time around, to "meet the peeps".

Goal is to complete first round before Xmas.

I will be available upon request, to do home visits as well, but I will stand by the HCMs as a pastoral support to their ministry, which is incredibly invaluable as an extension of the Worship Ministry of BSLC

Music and Worship:

I will meet with Marsha and a "Worship Team" to select hymns and Songs on a quarterly basis ahead, for everyone's preparation (and sanity!).

I really like the many touches and aspects present in BSLC worship services Advent and Lent Midweeks services:

Holden Evening Prayer (I LOVE this service!! It's my fave)

A scripture reading and a short message or Readers Theater presentation.

As an FYI, whenever requested and appropriate, *I welcome the involvement of other pastors in occasional services, like weddings and funerals*, esp. if they are known by the families involved. As I am in a unique place in relation to the needs of these services, nothing beats the personal touch that guest colleagues can bring to services like these.

The Game Plan

(Projected timeline is for speculative purposes only, and not to be confused with the surprising work of God's Hand in all this! Any resemblance to said timeline and what actually happens is purely God-incidental!)

Nov-Dec 2015:

Business as usual Getting to know each other, i.e. Pastor Mark and BSLC Enjoy the holidays

Jan-March 2016:

The Congregation Conversations. Purpose, Goals and Process:

To gather the people of BSLC to reflect upon BSLC's mission and ministry, celebrate strengths, be honest about growing edges, and envision God-Inspired Mission Goals that will inform and guide BSLC's next chapter in mission, partnered by the people, Leadership and next Long-Term Pastor and Staff.

Gather the people of BSLC together into Small Groups of 6-12 peeps, facilitated by teams of 2 people (to be identified with the help of the Council and trained by Pastor Mark) to reflect, share with each other, and respond to the following questions:

What is a strength of BSLC

What hasn't worked well at BSLC?

What are the challenges/opportunities facing BSLC?

Name 3-5 Mission Goals you believe God is calling/nudging/cajoling BSLC to embrace and implement in her next ministry chapter?

What are you willing to change re: how we do business, in order for those Mission Goals to become reality?

What are the Leadership Skills (note NOT personal qualities) the next Long-Term Pastor needs to bring to help BSLC's Mission Goals to become reality? These responses will be recorded and collected as they are, no names attached, and Pastor Mark will:

Collate the responses under each question

Ask Council and others to winnow down and lift out the highlight reel, 3-5 reoccurring themes, priorities, ext. that stand out from the responses per each questions

I will synthesize a summary of the highlights, standout responses, along with my own observations, suggestions, challenges points-to-ponder to the Council and Congregation.

March-May 2016:

Assuming concurrence by all re; the Congregation Conversations Summary, next steps are: Council will have already been praying and discerning since the beginning of the year, about who will serve on the Call Committee. This Team of BSLC will best be formulated:

NO less than 6 and no more than 9 members, equal as possible gender numbers and a variety of age demographics of BSLC

An additional 1-2 Youth Representatives

The Call Committee and the Council will have an evening meeting with Pastor Jane Mar, Assistant to the Bishop, who will present an overview of the Call/Interview Process. She and I will be resources to help the Call Committee, during this time to:

Fill out the Ministry Site Profile (MSP). The MSP is the key documents in the Call Process that:

Provide contact information of the Call Committee and references

Financial information and congregational demographics

Pastoral Compensation Package perimeters

History, Mission Goals, Strengths and Challenges of BSLC

Identified Mission Goals

Identified Leadership Goals needed from next Rostered Leader

The core material used will be the summary of the Congregations Conversations

May-August 2016

The Call Committee will meet to fill out completely the MSP

Pastor Jane and I will serve as resources

The Call Committee will keep the Pastors (s) and Leadership in the loop as to progress and process

Drafts of the MSP will be reviewed by The Council, Pastors Mark and Jane until a final draft is agreed by all involved

July-August 2016:

Final review of the MSP by Leadership, Pastor Mark and Synod MSP is released onto the ELCA National Database.

August 2016-? (next 6-18 months):

The Interview Phase of the Call Process will take 6-18 months, typically, and depends on: The given pool of candidates available at any given time

The match of said pool of candidates' leadership skills to BSLC's Mission Goals

All involved with how interviews go, e.g. schedules, timing, results of interviews, and so forth

Final Points-to-Ponder:

While this is a representative timeline, and typical of how this process goes, please keep in mind:

This process takes on a life of it on and is unique to each setting.

The time taken, and I will insist that time is taken to do all steps well, on each phase of this process will determine how well-represented BSLC will be represented on the MSP (namely strengths, growing edges, history, your willing ness to be honest, the passion and excitement exhibited in daring and bold Mission Goals) and will inform the quality of candidates you interview

Do NOT, I beg you, fall for the myth "When we get the "Right Pastor"....such a beast does not exist. What does exist are compelling, challenging, exciting Mission Goals that will attract top-tier candidates who will partner with you.

Don't, please please, be "pastor-centric". Be MISSION CENTRIC

This process will happen sooner than we expected (to our delight) or take longer than we wish.

That's not the point. This process is on God's timetable, not ours.

In the meantime we keep on keeping on in faithfulness to the ministries before us, and believe me, BSLC has a lot of exciting ministry happening already

The most important Mission Goal, above all, is the kind of welcoming, hospitable mission-driven culture you create here at BSLC. That is what will attract next pastors and new members alike
