Easter Breakfast will be from 8:00 am until 9:00 am on Easter morning.


Property—Discussions continue on replacing the two water heaters for the gym kitchen and restrooms.



Treasurer's Summary

For the month of February our income was \$14.677.16 on a budget of \$18,916.66. The giving for Sunday, Feb 28th was not deposited until March 1st so that will be reflected in the March income. Our expenses were \$9,096.60 on a budget of \$18,181.05 which was \$9,084.45 under budgeted expenses. Our income for the month was \$5,580.56 more than expenses. The Call Committee process continues to progress and we all look forward to updates on the candidate search soon. To date, Members have given \$2,789.02 towards the Call process! We have received \$2,020.00, into our Insurance Deductible fund as well which is very encouraging to help us be prepared and protected in the event we would have a major property damage claim in the future. Again, thank you to those that have given to these funds as it continues to make us healthier to build these dedicated fund accounts to the levels we need. It has been great to see Church members returning to Worship services that have not been able to attend for quite a while. It warms the soul of our Church for sure! 


