New Business—Laurie Dale presented to the council a gift to the church of a beautiful handcrafted quilt commemorating the church's 70th anniversary.

Looking Ahead-

70th Anniversary- September 30 is the date scheduled for the celebration of this milestone.

Pastor's Report—We enjoyed a week of vacation from July 3rd – 9th visiting Wendi's family in North Carolina. Otherwise, we continued our usual work of visiting homebound and hospitalized members, attending committee meetings, working with Cheryl to get bulletins and newsletters done, and being available to visit with members and others both in the church office and at Palace Coffee House.

We met with was Faith Grisham, Randall County's Better Living for Texans Extension Assistant. She shared with us details of a free "Fresh Start to a Healthier You" program she wants to offer at Beautiful Savior to our food pantry clients and anyone else who may be interested. She will promote the program on July 19th and 26th during our food pantry hours, and if there is sufficient interest start a four-session class on August 23rd at 9:30 AM. Participants who complete all four sessions will receive a reusable grocery bag full of useful kitchen gadgets.

Pastor Steve also met with Crystal Taylor with Interim Health Care Home Care and Hospice; Hospice is looking for volunteers to provide companionship to people in the final months of life. See flyer on the bulletin board for more details or talk with Pastor Steve.

Evangelism — Working to update the BSLC constitution with Pastor Steve and Jonathan Hinders.

Fellowship— Coordinated food for VBS, and the church BBQ on July 23. We plan to have a leftover BBQ on Aug 6 at 12.00 pm. The next committee meeting will be on August 9. Fajitas' will be served with sides contributed by attendees. A 'Corn Meal/Jello Deal' is planned for August 26 at 6:00 pm. Congregation members are encouraged to grab a couple of cans of surplus corn from the church food pantry and bring a dish using the corn, and/or bring a jello dessert.

Office Report—

A weekly, monthly, quarterly and annual check list for cleaning the church is now in place.

FYI: Over 300 youth, (mission trips, Boy Scouts) stayed overnight in the church gym while traveling in June and July.

Property – Submitted a bid for repair work in the court-yard. The bid will be submitted to the congregation. A bid to relight the sanctuary was approved and tabled until August when financing will be discussed.

FINANCIAL NEWS

June 2017

Cash equivalent asset balance at the end of June was \$133,381 (\$595 decrease from the beginning of the year). \$81,724 is allocated to our Dedicated Accounts, the value of which has increased \$4,024 for the year. \$51,657 is available for the General Fund, the value of which has decreased by \$4,619 for the year. The value of investments in our Endowment Fund is \$164,446, an increase of \$5,132 for the year.

June donations to our General Fund were \$15,862 compared to our anticipated amount of \$20,379 (\$4,497 less than anticipated). Contributions to Dedicated Accounts were \$2,717. Total receipts for June were \$18,789.

Expenses for June were \$20,072 compared to a budgeted amount of \$22,780. Year-to-date Expenditures from the General Fund were \$123,895 compared to a budget of \$137,705, resulting in a \$13,810 underspend (\$11,378 underspend taking into consideration compensation differences).

Dedicated Accounts expenditures were \$2,149. Major expenditures were for benevolences (\$573), Helping Hand Fund (\$386), Fellowship Savings (\$745), and Memorial Fund (\$248).

General Fund expenditures for June exceeded income by \$4,000 (loss).



Social Concerns —God fed 225 people through the food pantry, the sewing group is taking a break for the summer, continued delivery of Meals on Wheels. Snack Pack 4 kids is not packing this summer. The ramp project did not build in June.

Worship—A big thank you to all who have signed up to assist with worship. Note: The sign-up sheet is posted on the bulletin board just outside the sacristy.


