I hope that your Easter celebrations were festive, filling, and what I just called them.... celebrations that Jesus is Risen, as God's checkmark of approval on all Jesus said, accomplished and is as the Fulfillment of everything Israel was meant to be (and failed to be), and the fulfillment of what the Passover was about.

We are heading into the next phases of the Interim Season/Call Process and I wanted to update you as to next steps:

The first 10 "Congregation Conversation" groups met and I heard nothing but positive feedback from the facilitators and participants alike. I'm VERY pleased what I have seen of the responses. Lots of exciting, and candid answers.

2 more sessions are offered for those who, for whatever reason, were not able to attend the first round. Days and times are: April 3 (9:30-11:00 am) and April 10 (12:30-2:00 pm).

Next Steps and projected dates:

Upon completion of the Conversation Groups, I will finish collating the responses into a single first draft. Copies will be given to all council members and facilitators to pick out 3-5 themes that stand out. These will be due back to me by the end of April.

Depending on how the previous step goes, I plan to present a powerpoint summary, with my recommendations and points-to-ponder, to the congregation TENTATIVELY May 15, after services, with a meal hosted by the Council.

If there is a consensus to accept the report, it will be given to the Call Committee. It will be the working document from which they will answer, in summary form, the "Mission Questions" on the Ministry Site Profile (MSP).

I will act as a resource as the Call Committee works on the MSP The MSP in all this drafts, will be reviewed by me, Pastor Jane, and the Council until we are all in concurrence as to the final version Final approval will happen at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Council, not done via email.

Upon final review of the MSP by both the Council and Synod, it will be released onto the ELCA National Database.

The Synod will look for and send (Rostered Leader Profile) RLPs as good matches come before them.... all depends on what pool of candidates is available when.

Also...... Pastor Jane Mar, Assistant to the Bishop NTNL Synod-ELCA, will meet with the Council and Call Committee April 6, 7:00 pm, for orientation over all aspects of the Interview Process.

#### Education—

- We are obtaining feedback from members regarding starting another adult Sunday school class.
- Will begin planning VBS soon.

#### Evangelism—

- The home communion team met at the end of February and continues to make home visits.
- MOPs now has 10 members. A program on parenting relating to childhood concerns has been offered to the group by Linda Allen.

#### Fellowship—

We had a successful Panhandle Conference, on March 12<sup>th</sup>, hosting several Pastors and members of the NTNL as well as some of the potential Bishop nominees. We also organized the Lenten Soup & Sandwich potluck dinners before Wednesday night services during lent as well as Easter breakfast.

#### Social Concerns—

God fed 122 people through the food pantry, 1 ramp built, the sewing group is sewing each Monday, continued delivery of Meals on Wheels. A committed group continues to pack bags at Snack Pack 4 Kids and provide other support.

#### Worship-

Thanks to the Altar Guild for their had work during the Lenten Schedule.

We will resume regular schedule in April.

Worship leader spots are being filled.

Received 2 new banners for Lent, .

We have two more **Conversation Groups** as part of the discernment and call process scheduled on April 4 (9:30 - 11:00 am) and on April 11 (12:30-2:00 pm)

A new Bishop will be elected and chosen at this years' Mission Assembly. This means major transitions, and, depending on outcome, and could affect timing of when congregations, including BSLC, will receive names.

This stage of the Call/Interview Process takes on a life of its own, and will happen sooner than we expect (to our pleasant surprise!), or longer than we want.

I have updated my RLP (Rostered Leader Profile) and am in Call Process too.

#### FINANCIAL NEWS

Cash equivalent asset balance at the end of February is \$148,140 (\$4,540 increase for the year). Investments in our Endowment Fund is \$114,660.

February donations to our General Budget were \$22,165 compared to our anticipated amount of \$27,925. Other receipts were (\$135) compared to an anticipated amount of \$125. Year-to-Date income is \$38,405 compared to our anticipated amount of \$48,745. Contributions to Dedicated Accounts were \$4,685. Total income for February is \$26,720. (see charts)

Expenses for February were \$20,420 compared to a budgeted amount of \$22,990. The major area of underspend is Property because the budget includes \$1,250 per month for parking lot repairs (should have budgeted lump sum in month of expected expenditure) and utilities not paid until March. Overspend was for Pastor's pension/health insurance because of catch-up for payment not made in January. Dedicated Accounts expenditures were \$2,915 (\$700 Helping Hand, \$640 Education, \$150 Fellowship, \$575 Special Misc, \$850 Altar Guild).

Total income for February exceeded expenditures by \$3,380.

Laurie has completed training with the SMP (Senior Medicare Patrol) in Houston. The SMP was founded in 1997 by the U.S. Administration of Aging, an agency of the United States Department of Health and Human Resources. The SMP is also a program of the Better Business Bureau Education Foundation. The goal of SMP is to empower seniors to prevent healthcare fraud through outreach and education. The 25 minute presentation will focus on the SMP message: "Protect, Detect, and Report" and includes a power point and an 8 minute video.

At the conclusion of my presentation I will provide informative handouts including a "Personal Health Care Journal" and several documents summarizing the main points of the material which include the phone number of the SMP for asking questions about, or reporting fraud and abuse.






