FINANCIAL NEWS

July 2015

Cash equivalent asset balance at the end of July is \$138,260 (\$31,015 increase for the year). "Investments in our endowment Fund is \$118,605 (\$3,010 increase for the year).

July giving to our General budget was \$18,635 compared to our anticipated amount of \$21,580. "Year to Date giving is \$166,430 compared to our anticipated amount of \$145,760. "Building Fund donations were only \$50 this month, indicating that our communications have been successful. "In addition, our congregation has Contributed \$3,200 (YTD'\$25,445) to all other Dedicated Accounts. "Total giving for July is \$21,885 (YTD \$202,800).

Expenses for July were \$20,405 (YTD \$142,720) compared to a budgeted amount of \$27,250 (YTD \$184,555). Since we do not yet have a Family & Youth Minister, the comparison should exclude the budgeted amount for that position. In this case, the Budget for July would be \$23,884.

Expenditures for July exceeded donations by \$1,770 (YTD donations greater than Expenditures by \$23,710).

The Building Fund balance of \$3,500 has not yet been transferred to the Capital Improvements Fund. That will occur in August.

Now what?

With Pastor Stephen's move, one might feel a little out of sorts and fearful. One might ask, will the congregation lose momentum with our ministries? Who's going to pick up the slack and get things done?

Simply put, our urge as faithful members of Beautiful Savior is to be followers. That task is easy when a pastor is setting the example. But we were not following a pastor – we followed his example. We are followers of Jesus.

Ponder that for a moment – followers of Jesus. Consider how his disciples felt when he ascended into heaven. He had left them a message to take the news of reconciliation with God through his death and resurrection, but then he was gone from their midst. Luke tells us (Luke 24:52 -53) that they worshiped him and then they praised God at the temple.

And in Acts, the story begins with the disciples gathering to select another disciple, and then going to the temple for Pentecost where they began sharing the good news.

Their actions are our example. We can still gather to worship in full force, we can still pray for those in need, and we can still minister in all the ways we have served in the community. These tasks are much more beneficial to congregational life than hand wringing and head shaking.

At times we might feel uncertain about which way to go. Ministry is a puzzle. Just when we think we have everything figured out and can go into cruise control, pieces of the puzzle change.

But God's light shines just as brightly today as it did a week ago or a month ago or a year ago. Look for that light to figure out how we can pick up the pieces of the puzzle and get moving with again.
